Florence and Appleton Clark were members of the Chevy Chase Literary Club

Florence Perry Clark (1864-?) and Appleton P. Clark, Jr. (1865-1955). Appleton Clark is considered one of Washington's most prominent architects during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. He designed the original Strathmore Hall and the home of Vernon Hodges at 5 East Kirke Street, as well as hundreds of buildings throughout the Washington, D. C. area. Florence was described in the 1913 edition of the *Economy Administration Cook Book* as a "homemaker, church and club woman," specializing in "Baptist Toast," "Mock Terrapin," and "spoon Bread." They lived at 1762 Lanier Place NW, in the District of Columbia.
